

eyes and had a nap!




With the DSBN Parent Council Conference on the 4th, at Eden High School, our SAC and some Pelham parents attended and participated in the various workshops available.

Designed to be a second language program for children whose first language is **NOT** French; Current enrolment of over 2,500 elementary students;


Certificate of French Immersion Studies awarded upon successful completion of the elementary and secondary Immersion program;
