Immunization Record Review: Is Your Child's Vaccination Record Up to Date?

The Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA), Amending Reg. 645 of R.R.O. 1990, requires Public Health to collect and maintain immunization records for all school-aged children in Niagara. At the beginning of December 2015, letters were mailed to parents/legal guardians of elementary and secondary school students who have incomplete immunization records on file at Public Health.

If you received this **Immunization Notice** in the mail (blue form) please ensure that you provide the required immunization information to Public Health in order to avoid suspension from school. Safety First!

Perhaps you have heard from the students something about "walk and talk" fitness breaks. This is something that we have tried this year when the grounds are especially wet, the playing field is slippery and difficult to play on, or fresh air would be great, but the usual play areas are not appropriate to be on due to workers felling trees or doing maintenance at the same time as our fitness break. Students are being supervised outdoors yet they are asked to walk and talk instead of game playing. The tarmac is a small place for our 140 students to be mobile with balls bouncing around everyone. So this time is spent playing hand games, visiting with their peers, or playing mental math/word games. It's all for "safety sake"!

Did you know that we have also had 12 confirmed cases of concussion since school began? We are also instructing sending player to get eye contact with the receiving player before a ball is passed. Teachers and students are hit daily by students passing freely and not checking to ensure someone knows the ball is coming. We continue to set the weekly goal of no concussions. Active supervision by teachers continues and first aid is provided as needed!

Bus Safety has improved. Students are encouraged to report to the office, any concerns on the buses daily. They can also let the bus driver know that there is a problem on the bus.

French Immersion Registration

The French Immersion program (offered at French Immersion sites) is open to all students in Senior Kindergarten interested in enrolling for the 2016-2017 year. Designed to be a second language program for children whose first language is **NOT** French; Current enrolment of over 2,500 elementary students;


Certificate of French Immersion Studies awarded upon successful completion of the elementary and secondary Immersion program;
